Enhancing Immigration Laws on the Interior

Re-instituting of Secure Communities & 287g Agreements

- Collaboration between ICE & state and local law enforcement

Take Federal Funding from Sanctuary Cities

- Sanctuary Cities are jurisdictions that limit local law enforcement cooperation with federal immigration agents

New Expanded Priorities = No Prioritization = Higher Risk

- Anyone who initially entered without documents
- Anyone with a final removal order
- Anyone charged with any criminal offense

Hiring of 10,000 additional ICE agents

Increased Border Enforcement:

- Mandatory detention of all immigrants apprehended while they go through removal
- Construction of a wall along the Southern Border
- 5,000 new border patrol agents
- More detention facilities near southern border
- **Expands use of expedited removal** -- deportation without ever seeing a judge or having a hearing -- for anyone who can't prove they have been here for more than two years

Restriction of Refugees:

- 90 day ban for issuance of new visas from 6 Muslim Majority Countries: Iran, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria & Yemen

CURRENTLY ON HOLD PENDING

- 120 day suspension of entire refugee admissions program applies to all countries (Exceptions on Case-by-Case basis)

IMMIGRANT COMMUNITIES ARE NOT ALONE!

Cities, organizations and community members in Chicago and across the country are standing up to oppose these anti-immigrant executive orders:

"We're gonna stay a sanctuary city...There is no stranger among us. We welcome people, whether you're from Poland or Pakistan, whether you're from Ireland or India or Israel and whether you're from Mexico or Moldova, where my grandfather came from, you are welcome in Chicago as you pursue the American Dream." - Mayor Rahm Emanuel

Know Your Rights

REMAIN SILENT

- DO NOT LIE

SPEAK WITH AND BE REPRESENTED BY AN ATTORNEY

- In Immigration, at our own expense

DO NOT SIGN ANYTHING

REQUEST A TELEPHONE CALL

- Memorize phone numbers of your contacts with legal status
- Immigrants have the right to call their consulate

Know Your Rights with the Police

If you are Stopped on the Street:

- Tell the officer you do not want to speak
- Ask if you are free to go and walk away calmly
- You are not obligated to respond to any questions

If you are Stopped in your Vehicle:

- If you are the driver, you will be asked to provide driver's license and proof of insurance
- Police need to have probable cause to believe that criminal activity is happening to search your car

"Am I free to go?"

Court and Bond: Police

Court

If you have court or probation and you do not go you will have a warrant for your ARREST.

Bond

- Pay 10% of bond
- Bond will be reimbursed or credited.

Know your Rights with ICE: If ICE Comes to Your Home

DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR

- You are NOT required to open the door unless ICE has a warrant **signed by a judge**.
- Ask them to show you the warrant – Slide it under your door or hold it up to the window.

IF THEY TRY TO FORCE THE DOOR OPEN

Write down the agents' badge numbers and vehicles' license plate numbers

IF ICE COMES TO YOUR WORKPLACE

ICE needs to have a judicial warrant or permission from your employer to enter your workplace.

Sample Administrative Warrant

And pursuant to the following provisions of the Immigration and Nationality Act: Section 241 (a) (5) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (Act), as amended.

I, the undersigned officer of the United States, by virtue of the power and authority vested in the Attorney General under the laws of the United States and by his or her direction command you to take into custody any individual from the United States the above-named alien, pursuant to law at the expense of the Immigration, Salaries and Expenses Immigration and Customs Enforcement, "including the expense of an attendant if necessary."

ORDER
 FOR WARRANT FOR
 ENTRY ON PREMISES TO
 SEARCH FOR ALIENS
 WHO ARE IN THE UNITED
 STATES WITHOUT LEGAL
 AUTHORITY

The United States of America, having filed an application to authorize officers of United States Immigration and Customs without legal authority and, if any such persons are found on the premises, to exercise their authority pursuant to section 287 of the Immigration and Nationality Act, a U.S.C. § 3197, to question them to determine whether they are such aliens and, if there is probable cause to believe they are such aliens, to arrest them.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement shall conduct the entry and search during daylight hours with ten (10) days of the issuance of this warrant, and make its return to this Court with ten (10) days of the date the entry and search have been completed.

If you are Detained by ICE

1. Remain Silent
2. Do Not Sign Anything
3. A Number (9 digits)
4. Call your Attorney or Emergency Contact
5. Call your Consulate

If a Family Member is Detained by ICE

1. Locate them: LOCATOR.ICE.GOV
2. Call your consulate's emergency #
México: (855)463-6395
3. The person who pays bond must have legal status
4. Call your attorney
5. Call ICIRR emergency hotline

Court and Bond: Immigration

Court:

If you have court or supervision and you do not go you will have an order of DEPORTATION.

Bond:

- You must pay 100%
- The person who pays must be a U.S. Citizen or Legal Permanent Resident.
- Bond is reimbursed at the end of your case

Basic vocabulary to exercise your rights:

I wish to remain silent.

I wish to speak with a lawyer as soon as possible.

I do not consent to your entry.

I do not consent to your search of these premises.

I will not sign any document I do not understand.

Begin Preparing Your Emergency Plan

1. Identify who will take care of your children and assets and have a meeting about it
2. Update your emergency contact information at your children's school and doctor
3. Apply for your children's double nationality and their passport and verify your options with your consulate
4. Gather important documents in a safe place and make sure your emergency contact is aware of it
5. Save money. Make sure your bank account is connected to a debit card so you can access it in another country and make sure you have access to online banking
